TEXAS WELL OWNER NETWORK

The "Well Informed" TWON program is an educational program that gives well owners the opportunity to have their well water samples screened for common contaminants including total coliform, *E. coli*, nitrates and TDS salinity. The screening of the water samples is followed by a 1-hour explanation of the results the next day, water well protection practices and focuses on wellhead protection and recommendations for remediating well contamination.
